MILWAUKEE WATER WORKS RATE INCREASES

The Public Service Commission (PSC) has approved the 2013 Milwaukee Water Works rate increase. This is a 3% rate increase that took effect on June 1, 2014. The average residential water user in the Village will see an estimated \$0.36 increase in their quarterly water bill.

Milwaukee Water Works has also requested a rate increase for 2014. This request would amount to an estimated 30% rate increase to the Village of Brown Deer. We have intervened in the rate case, along with six other surrounding communities in an effort to reduce the proposed increase. A hearing in front of the PSC is scheduled for June 25th to review all of the testimony.

DEALING WITH INCLEMENT WEATHER

We are diligently monitoring water levels in the Village's sanitary sewer collection system during heavy rain events. Problem areas are the manholes at North 60th and West Darnel and at North 59th and West Range. Monitoring is occurring throughout the day and outside normal operation hours. If water levels breach pipe capacities, DPW will take emergency action and pump directly to the MMSD interceptor sewer to help avoid the possibility of basement back-ups.

CHILD IMMUNIZATIONS

Although summer just started, if your child will need immunizations before the start of the next school year, now is the time to schedule an appointment. If you don't have health insurance and need immunizations for your child, call the Health Department at 414-371-2980 to discuss your options. Vaccines for Children (VFC) is a federal program that offers vaccinations to eligible children. If you have health insurance that pays for immunizations, please call your health care provider for an appointment, as we cannot provide VFC to ineligible children or we risk losing our ability to offer vaccines through the program.
