### **Department of Public Works**

Heartland Construction has finished all major water main work and sanitary sewer lateral replacement work on W. Carolann Drive between N. 67<sup>th</sup> Street & N. Bethanne Drive and on W. Glenbrook Road between N. 65<sup>th</sup> Street & N. 67<sup>th</sup> Street. DPW crews are scheduled to complete re-ditching work and driveway culvert replacement the week of August 11<sup>th</sup> and August 18<sup>th</sup>. The roadways are expected to be pulverized and re-paved with asphalt the week of August 25<sup>th</sup> by the contractor Payne & Dolan, Inc.

# **Reconstruction Project on W. County Line Road**

The W. County Line Road reconstruction project is underway. The contractor has completed the driveway culvert installations, fire hydrant relocations, and brush clearing/grubbing. Current work includes re-ditching and roadway widening to accommodate the 4-ft paved shoulders and 2-ft gravel shoulders adjacent to the 11-ft travel lanes. Major work is occurring between N. 67<sup>th</sup> Street and N. 60<sup>th</sup> Street. The project completion date is tentatively September 30<sup>th</sup>. The roadway is **CLOSED** to thru traffic and open to local traffic and businesses only. Please drive with caution when using W. County Line Road as the area is an active construction zone. The contractor and workers appreciate drivers using caution to ensure their safety.

#### The Building Inspection Department

The Building Inspection Department issued the following permits this week: (4) Certificate of Compliance for residential real estate sale. (10) Building permits, (13) Electrical permits, Erosion Control for new residential construction, (2) HVAC permits, and (2) Plumbing permits.

The Building Inspection Department also conducted the following inspections: (3) rough Building inspections, (8) final Building inspections, (5) rough Code Compliance inspections for real estate sales, (1) rough Electrical inspection, (8) final Electrical inspections, (2) final HVAC inspections, (1) final Occupancy inspection, (2) rough Plumbing inspections, and (2) final Plumbing inspections.

**BEAUTIFICATION/FORESTRY:** The Director and Admin. Assistant attended the Beautification Committee meeting this week on Tuesday, August 13th. The August residential landscape awards were selected by the committee. The landscaping awards event is scheduled for Tuesday, September 16th from 6:30pm to 8:30pm at the Community Center. DPW also discussed the "median planter bed renewal" project and received consensus from the committee to proceed with the current plans.

# Weekly Health Tip

Recreational Water Illnesses (RWIs) are the various illnesses caused by germs that can contaminate water in pools, lakes, and the ocean.

Diarrhea is the most common recreational water illness. Tiny amounts of fecal matter are rinsed off all swimmers' bottoms as they swim through the water. Swallowing even a small amount of water that has been contaminated with germs can make you sick.

That is why it is so important to stay out of the pool if you are sick with diarrhea, shower before swimming, and avoid swallowing pool water.
