



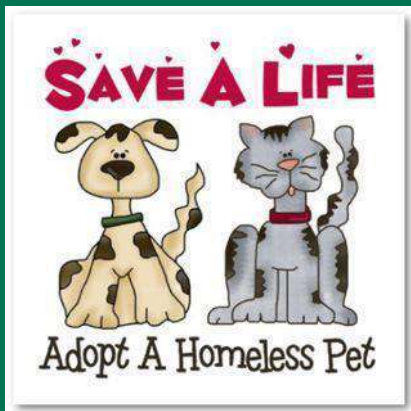

News Release: Senior Living Community Announces Expansion Plans in Brown Deer at Beaver Creek

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that a public information meeting will be held about the New Perspective Senior Living project at the Beaver Creek Condo site, on Monday, August 25th, 2014 at 7:00pm in the Village Hall Board Room, 4800 W. Green Brook Drive. The purpose of the public meeting is to share information about the proposal and gather feedback about design plans prior to official Plan Commission review in September. Developer representatives will be in attendance and providing a presentation followed by a question and answer session. Reconstruction Project on W. Dean Road

The W. Dean Road reconstruction project is tentatively scheduled to start on Thursday, August 21st. The project limits are from N. 55th Street east to N. Teutonia Avenue (CTH D). The project will replace the deteriorating asphalt pavement and include 4-ft paved shoulders dueling as on-street bike lanes. A new concrete sidewalk will also be added along the north side of Dean Road within the service drive terrace area which is being funded 100% through the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) Safe Routes to School (SRTS) grant. Driveway culverts, driveway approach paving, and re-ditching will also occur as part of the project. The roadway will be **CLOSED** to thru traffic during construction, but will remain open to residents who live within the project limits. The estimated project completion date is October 15th, 2014.

The Zoning & Planning Specialist

As of August 4th, 2014, the Zoning & Planning Specialist has entered 222 code violations into the BS&A municipal database system. Roughly 135 of these code violations have been resolved (60.8% resolution rate). The "grass/lawn complaint" season appears to have plateaued. At the current rate, the Community Services Department expects to process approximately 350 code compliance violations and the goal is to resolve at least 315 (90%) by the end of 2014.

BEAUTIFICATION/FORESTRY



Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) chemical treatments have now been completed as part of the Urban Forestry Grant (UFG) the Village received from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WDNR). The Director solicited a quote from a local landscaping contractor to assist DPW with the chemical treatment applications due to the heavy workload currently at DPW. The contractor has finished treating trees on the following streets:

N. 67th St., N. 55th St., N. Goldendale Dr., W. Silverbrook Ln., N. Bethanne Dr., Plaza Cir., N. Maura Ln. (adj. to Hanson Park), W. Green Brook Dr. (East of N. 51st St. to N. Arbon Dr.), Village Park.
