## Partisan Office Election on August 12, 2014

## Reconstruction Project on W. Dean Road

The W. Dean Road reconstruction project is tentatively scheduled to start on Monday, August 11th. The project limits are from N. 55<sup>th</sup> Street east to N. Teutonia Avenue (CTH D). The project will replace the deteriorating asphalt pavement and include 4-ft paved shoulders dueling as on-street bike lanes. A new concrete sidewalk will also be added along the north side of Dean Road within the service drive terrace area which is being funded 100% through the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) Safe Routes to School (SRTS) grant. Driveway culverts, driveway approach paving, and re-ditching will also occur as part of the project. The roadway will be closed to thru traffic during construction, but remain open to residents who live within the project limits. The estimated project completion date is October 15th.

A notice was sent to all residents within the project limits.

## Hwy 100 and Hwy 57 Intersection

The Community Development Director assisted and attended the WisDOT open house on the HWY 100 and 57 interchange proposal. Comments are being accepted until August 10th with WISDOT seeking to select a preferred design alternative later this year.

## Immunization Clinics

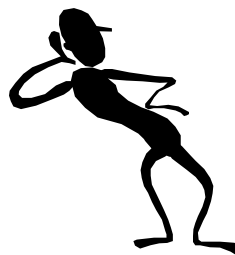
