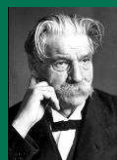

Community Development Services

- The Community Development Director met with the North Shore Fire Department to discuss methods for notifying new businesses and developers of the submittal requirements for the occupancy approval from the Fire Department. A new handout was prepared and is on file in the Inspection department and links to Fire Department applications have been added to the Village website.
- The Community Development Director and Public Works Superintendent met with engineers from Ayres Associates to review final design plans for Bradley Road. Discussion focus on minor design tweaks and how to appropriately stage the construction and maintain access to businesses. The project remains on schedule for bidding this fall and construction next spring.
- The Community Development Director attended the UWM Innovative Cities Lecture Series on triple bottom line development which explored green urban infill redevelopment in Milwaukee and the lessons learned from leveraging community funding and governmental assistance.



North Shore Health Department

The North Shore Health Department held four flu clinics open to the public and visited three separate businesses to administer flu shots.

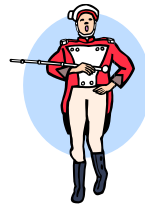
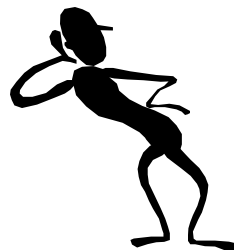
Spooky Read for Teens:
