



Department of Public Works

STREETS & TRAFFIC: DPW crews will be installing "no parking" signs as per Village Ordinance within 30-ft of driveway openings on the west side of N. 55th Street, North of W. Brown Deer Road.



W. COUNTY LINE ROAD RECONSTRUCTION:



The W. County Line Road project is **now substantially complete** and fully open to thru traffic. Last week the contractors installed all resident mailboxes, painted the pavement marking lines, and completed the 2-ft gravel shouldering. Remaining project work includes regulatory sign installation which will be completed by DPW crews during the next 2-weeks. Additionally, general site landscaping and clean-up is expected to occur over the next 2-weeks. Final landscaping and grass seeding will take place in the spring of 2015.




W. DEAN ROAD RECONSTRUCTION:

The estimated project completion date is November 15th. Last week the contractor, Zenith Tech, completed all of the outstanding concrete work and pedestrian ramp installations. The paving contractor, Payne & Dolan completed the final surface course asphalt paving on Saturday, November 8th, and Monday, November 10th. The grading contractor, Baumhardt Sand & Gravel, installed the 2-ft gravel shoulder material on Tuesday, November 11th. General site clean-up work and landscaping work will continue throughout the next 2-weeks. Any remaining landscaping and grass seeding will take place in the spring of 2015. The project limits are from N. 55th Street east to N. Teutonia Avenue (CTH D). The project will replace the deteriorating asphalt pavement and include 4-foot paved shoulders dueling as on-street bike lanes.

The Community Services Department

The Community Development Director worked with the Police Department and the development teams of Goodwill and Metro Storage to finalize plans security lighting plans for the two projects. Both are currently under construction with openings scheduled in spring of 2015.

As of November 5th, 2014, the Zoning & Planning Specialist has entered 275 code violations into the BS&A municipal database system. Roughly 178 of these code violations have been resolved (64.7% resolution rate). At the current rate, the Community Services Department expects to process approximately 320 code compliance violations. The department's 2014 goal is to resolve at least 288 of them (90%) by the end of 2014.

Weekly Health Tip

Are you concerned about your blood pressure?

Did you know that high blood pressure is the most important predictor of heart and kidney disease?

Make it a point to get your blood pressure checked. Call the North Shore Health Department at 414-371-2980 for a FREE appt.

What do the Blood Pressure numbers mean?

Blood Pressure is typically recorded as two numbers, written as a ratio like this:

120
80

Systolic: The top number, which is also the higher of the two numbers, measures the pressure in the arteries when the heart beats (when the heart muscle contracts).

Diastolic: The bottom number, which is also the lower of the two numbers, measures the pressure in the arteries between heartbeats (when the heart muscle is resting between beats and refilling with blood).
