WATER UTILITY NEWS

2016 Water main relay project is scheduled to being on Monday, May 9th on N. 52nd St. between Dean Road & Churchill. Letters will be sent to homeowner's prior the start of construction detailing the construction project.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT

Final enforcement action was taken at the W Mart, 4685 W. Bradley Rd. for nuisance violations related to signage, trash & disabled vehicles. Failure to correct the issues could result in conditional use permit revocation.

The Development Director & NS Health Director submitted an Aetna Foundation healthy communities grant to help establish an Oak Leaf trailhead in the Original Village.

The Development Director reviewed plans for a gas station & office building development at 9001 N. Green Bay Road on the vacant land north of the Fox 6 studios.

Letters were mailed to the development community soliciting interest in a possible “Request For Proposals” (RFP) for the Public Works yard at 8717 N. 43rd Street.

National Infant Immunization Week (NIIW)

NIIW is an annual observance to highlight the importance of protecting infants from vaccine-preventable diseases and celebrate the achievements of immunization programs. Immunizations have made great achievement and a positive impact on the lives of infants and children. Some of the milestones reached includes:



- Through immunization, we can now protect infants and children from 14 vaccine-preventable diseases before age two.
- Vaccines have drastically reduced infant death and disability caused by preventable diseases in the United States
- In the 1950's, nearly every child developed measles, and unfortunately, some even died from this serious disease. Today, many practicing physicians have never seen a case of measles.
- Routine childhood immunization in one birth cohort prevents about 20 million cases of disease and about 42,000 deaths. It also saves about \$13.5 billion in direct costs.
- The National Immunization Survey has consistently shown that childhood immunization rates for vaccines routinely recommended for children remain at or near record levels.

The NSHD prevents vaccine preventable diseases through our Immunization Program. Immunizations are provided to uninsured, underinsured and in some limited cases for some vaccines, private payers. Additionally, the health department provides education and outreach to residents, healthcare providers, school nurses, media, and others on the epidemiology of vaccine-preventable diseases and current vaccine recommendations. In 2015, the NSHD offered 60 immunization clinics and 13 flu clinics.

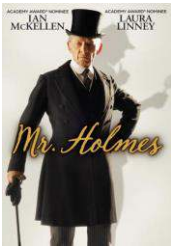
LIBRARY UPCOMING WEEK'S ACTIVITIES:

Enjoy Our Recreational Trails!

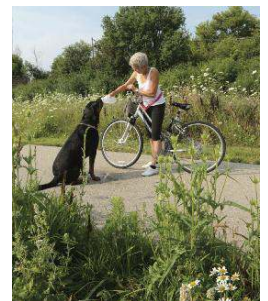
The beautiful Spring/Summer season is the perfect time to head outdoors to hike on our paved area trails, perfect for family enjoyment. Take advantage of these outstanding area trails!

The Brown Deer Recreational Trail is located along the Wisconsin Electric Power Co. right of way between W. Brown Deer Rd. and W. County Line Rd. Park in the Village Hall parking lot, 4800 W. Green Brook Dr., and access the trail from Village Park. This trail connects the Milwaukee Oak Leaf Trail to the Ozaukee Interurban Trail.

The Oak Leaf Trail is 96.4 miles long. It meanders in and around the city of Milwaukee on a changing terrain of flat rural plains and hilly city streets. It connects all of the major parks in Milwaukee County. The trail carries you down to the beautiful Lake Michigan and its beaches, all adding up to a great ride.

The Ozaukee Interurban Trail is a 32-mile path through the communities of Mequon, Thiensville, Cedarburg, Grafton, Port Washington, Belgium and Cedar Grove. This trail route connects historic downtowns with natural landscapes. Views along the Trail include: woodlands, wetlands, farmlands, Cedar Creek, the Milwaukee River and Lake Michigan, and it is designated as a hotspot for birding.
