
## **Weekly Health Tips**

### **Ditch diet soda to lose weight**

Research from the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health revealed that overweight and obese adults who drank diet beverages ate more calories from food than those who drank regular soda. Additionally, a University of Texas study found that **diet soda drinkers** had a 70% greater increase in waist circumference than non-drinkers over the course of about 10 years.

"In addition, many people think 'low-fat,' 'low-sugar,' or 'light' means fewer calories, but that's not always true," says Goodson. "Typically when manufacturers cut something out and the end result tastes just as good, they've added something like additional sugar."

#### Did You Know?

Summer is in full swing and Fourth of July is just days away. As you celebrate with friends and family this weekend, it is important to remember some key safety tips about the use of fireworks. According to the US Consumer Product Safety Commission, 230 people on average go to the emergency room every day with fireworks-related injuries in the month around the July 4th holiday. Stay safe and follow these tips:

- Obey all local laws regarding the use of fireworks.
- Know your fireworks; read the cautionary labels and performance descriptions before igniting.
- A responsible adult should supervise all firework activities. Never give fireworks to children.
- Alcohol and fireworks do not mix. Save your alcohol for after the show.
- Wear safety glasses when shooting fireworks.
- Light one firework at a time and then quickly move away.
- Use fireworks outdoors in a clear area; away from buildings and vehicles.
- Never carry fireworks in your pocket shoot them into metal or glass containers.

### Last week at the North Shore Health Department

The health department has started surveillance for mosquito vectors of Zika Virus. At this time, we do not know whether any local populations of this mosquito occur in Wisconsin. The virus is transmitted by *Aedes aegypti*, the yellow fever mosquito, which does not occur in Wisconsin. A secondary vector may be *Aedes albopictus*, the Asian tiger mosquito. This mosquito is not known to occur in Wisconsin. However, the Asian tiger mosquito has been found in Minnesota repeatedly, at 1 location in
